

GASIP 3 - Tier Cluster Model



VALUE CHAIN CLUSTER DRIVER (VCD)

- VCD works with smallholder farmers as the supply base
- VCD has a well-defined market and buy-back arrangement with farmers
- VCD is committed to setup an out-grower offtake agreement
- VCD is willing to support with production inputs/services on credit to FBOs/SHFs

FARMER BASED ORGANIZATION (FBO)

- Participate in capacity building programs to improve the management and governance systems of members
- Support members, and facilitate the fulfillment of outgrower contract.
- Collect and provide the necessary data requested by GASIP for monitoring and evaluation purposes

SMALLHOLDER FARMERS (SHFs)

 Receive support for input/output markets and other resources from VCDs through an organised FBO arrangement
